ENDORSEMENT/SPONSORSHIP

The MACA conference is an educational program endorsed by the Office of State Courts Administrator and the Missouri Municipal League. It is designed to meet education requirements for the Certified Court Administrator and the Advanced Certified Court Administrator programs in any year. The 2009 Annual Conference is being sponsored by the College of Business, Missouri Training Institute, in cooperation with the Missouri Association for Court Administration.

LOCATION/HOTEL ACCOMODATIONS

All sessions will be held at the Tan-Tar-A Resort, Osage Beach, Missouri. A block of rooms is being held for the conference. The single/double/triple/quads rate is \$109.18; one bedroom suite is \$177.16 and two bedroom suite is \$237.93. A 3% tourism tax (not tax exempt) is included in the above prices per night.
